Course Overview

In the Foundations of Center-based Family Engagement course, family support professionals learn to effectively use the *Foundational Curriculum* as they work with families to partner, facilitate, and reflect. Both the training and curriculum cover children's growth and development, prenatally to age three.

Participants will learn to use the PAT *Foundational Curriculum* as a tool to inform family engagement practices. There will be an emphasis placed on developing relationship-based competencies across various aspects of service delivery. Participants will explore:

- > underpinning theories that inform the PAT approach
- core concepts of family engagement to best support family well-being development
- Strengthening Families Protective Factors™ framework to improve parenting behaviors and maximize child outcomes.

Course Facilitators

The course is instructed by certified facilitators who emphasize adult learning practices such as reflective practice and hands-on learning. Course facilitators will interact with you as guides throughout the course. They will present information to you and assist you in applying the concepts learned in the individual learning assignments in two-hour online live sessions.
